## July 2 to 5:

- Dismantle and store washroom partition walls,
- Remove fixtures (toilets, sinks, urinals, counter tops, etc.),
- Remove and store baseboards,
- Patch and paint as needed.

- Patch and paint as needed,
- Remove and replace washroom floor tiles and subfloor,
- Build separation wall in furnace room and install fire rated door and frame.


## July 15 to 19:

- Mud and paint the furnace room separation wall,
- Install cove (base board) moldings,
- Seal and wax washroom floor tiles.


## July 22 to 26:

- Install new washroom fixtures,
- Re-install washroom partition walls.


## July 29 to 31:

- Clean up, inspect and complete project,
- Submit final project reports to funding partners.

## Community Contribution Fishing the Moyie

The East Kootenays (all the Kootenays) is known for its good fly fishing. Most streams and rivers will produce good results...mostly trout.
If you're going to fly fish, stay to floating lines and top water flies.
Most locals will tell you to stay off the beaten path for best results.
Flies of choice would be 'Royal Coachman', most parachute flies work well, as does the 'Tom Thumb'.
If you're off the beaten path, be aware this is bear country!
Some regulation guidance:

- There is NO FISHING in any stream in Region 4 from Apr. 1 to June 14
- Single barbless hooks must be used in all streams of Region 4, all year.
- Irishman Creek (Moyie River tributary) is closed all year;
- No powered boats from the bridge at south end of Moyie Lake to the U.S. border
- Bull trout and cutthroat trout release
