Make sure all family members know what to do and teach children how to call 911 and that they can give their address.

The Yahk-Kingsgate area has a rich history filled with pioneers, lumber, railways and other endeavors. However, most of our archives are not stored in a way that preserves them long term. This makes our archives at risk of loss, and very difficult to share. For example, there are about 5,000 photos that we want to better preserve.

We applied for and were approved for the first phase of our Archive Project. This phase will include the visit of an experienced archivist to help us with an assessment of our archiving needs and to provide training to those that wish to receive **free training** on the tools and techniques for storing and digitizing our archive documents.

Training is set to begin in October, with work progressing through the winter months. Sign up or for further questions.

Some of this years Fall Fair items

How to make Pear Fruit Leather

It's that time of year for preserving the season's harvest. This fruit leather recipe is for pears, but you can use just about any fruit combos.

What you need:

4 cups fresh fruit - peeled, cored and cubed 1/4 cup water

lemon juice, cinnamon, nutmeg (to taste)

How to make it:

Add the fruit and water to a large saucepan. Let it simmer, stirring, for 10 - 15 minutes until the fruit is cooked. Use a potato masher to soften.

Taste the mix. Add lemon juice, cinnamon, and nutmeg to your liking. Continue to simmer another 5-10 minutes.

Puree the mix in a blender.

Line a baking sheet with parchment paper, making sure the paper covers the sides and won't fall into the mix. Pour evenly onto the baking sheet, about 1/8 to 1/4 inch thick.

Set your oven as low as it goes (about 150) and bake for about 8 - 12 hours. Keep an eye on the baking, as ovens vary for how long it will take to dehydrate. You'll know it's done when it's dry and has that leathery consistency.

Gently peel it from the parchment paper and roll it up in plastic wrap to store, or tear into strips to eat!
